The Chair checked if members of the public had any objection to the meeting being visually recorded by a member of the public.

1. To receive apologies for absence  
Apologies were received as above.
2. To receive declarations of interest from Councillors  
Cllr D Martin – item 3 non pecuniary
3. To consider the impact on Events during the forthcoming works to create a Skate Park at Underwood Community/Recreation Ground

Cllr David Martin gave his views on the situation.

Mr Paul Lake gave a Powerpoint presentation on behalf of Underwood Festival Committee in the hope of finding a solution for Underwood Festival on 6<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and the Skate Park start date 24<sup>th</sup> June 2019 to both go ahead this year.

A report from ADC including their recommendations was emailed to all Councillors prior to the meeting and was attached to the Agenda circulated in the meeting.

The Clerk read out a letter from James Spriggs on behalf of the Youth Outreach group in Underwood.

Concerns were raised that moving the position of the Skate Park could create Health & Safety issues regarding the use of the football pitch.

It was noted that the current access through the Community Centre Car Park is already difficult due to the building. The Parish Council are looking at improving or rebuilding the Community



Centre so it's quite likely that access will change in the future. The Recreation Ground and the Community Centre should ideally have their own separate vehicle access. This year's Festival is the main concern for access of the showman type vehicles.

It was proposed that the start date for the Skate Park works is delayed until the 8<sup>th</sup> July 2019 and that the position of the Skate Park is moved back 5metres. The proposal was not supported by the Council. Cllr A Gascoyne left the meeting.

After further discussion including the fencing off of the skate park whilst works are in progress it was proposed that a temporary access is created from Church Lane directly onto the Recreation Ground for the Underwood Festival vehicles, that the Skate Park position is not changed, and a new permanent access created for next year. Paul Lake was able to show the proposed access on the Powerpoint presentation. The vote was unanimous.

**RESOLVED: To create a temporary access from Church Lane directly onto the Recreation Ground for this year's Underwood Festival and leave the Skate Park position unchanged. Skate Park works to be suitably fenced off. A permanent entrance will be created before next year's festival.**
